To keep our country growing.

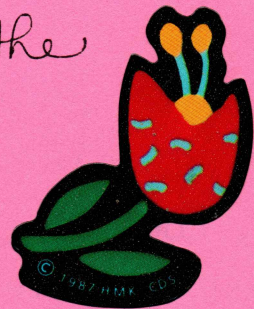


