PATENT AWARDS FOR GRANDPA RIEL

Recently Rohr announced the receipt of three new patents issued in the name of Grandpa Riel, along with tow co-inventors. The patents are identified as Nos. 5,041,526, titled "DIMBR FOR SYNTHESIS OF HIGH PERFOR-MANCE POLYMBR MATRIX COMPOSITES, 5,041,527, same title and 5,041,528, NEW DIMER FOR SYNTHESIS OF HIGH PERFORMANCE POLYMER MATRIX COM-POSITES. All three patents are assigned to Rohr, and the technology has been licensed to the American Cyanamid Corporation, on of the largest chemical companies in the USA. In a recent meeting with their scale up team they indicated that they estimate a sales level of \$25,000,000.00 per year by 1995. Since Rohr receives a royalty on total sales, it will fully recover the cost of the research carried out to develop the technology. For those who are not familiar with patents, a patent award entitles the owner exclusive rights to make, use and sell the product for 17 years, after which it can be manufactured by any interested company. 
JEOPOTTY (je' pot ee) n. The trauma of being trapped in the bathroom with an empty toilet tissue roll.

MONOSONGO (mah' no song' oh) n. The type of person who knows how to play only one song on the piano and keeps playing that one song over and over again.


EXPECSTEAKTION (ek spec stak' shun) n. The naive hope that the food in a restaurant will look as good as it does in the pictures on the menu.

Ninja-Turtles of the Technochrome by Bryce Sorem ages




