GRANDMA RIEL LECTURES NEW CITIZENS - Recently Grandma was invited by Listy, on behalf of an organization she belongs to, to address a group of new citizens. As a naturalized but long time citizen Grandma was invited to share her experiences and reactions to being an American. Among other experiences she described her reaction to racial segregation she saw at church, when we first moved to Maryland in 1951. At that time all of the black members of the congregation were seated in the back pews in the church. She was outraged by this expression of intolerance, and to show her feelings she sat with the black people. She used this action to point out how important it is for everyone to express their opposition to racial intolerance whenever they have the opportunity. She also stressed how important it is for new citizens to become fluent in Bnglish so that at election time they can inform themselves on the candidates and issues. We understand that the talk was well received, and representatives of the local press took photographs to record the event.
