NEW TRACHER ON THE JOB THIS FALL



For the A solution the one half must be turned over to fit. A good example of a mirror image is your two hands. They are similar but not identical. The best solution is B, where the two parts are identical.

SUPER BABY SITTING DAY AT GRANDMA'S


