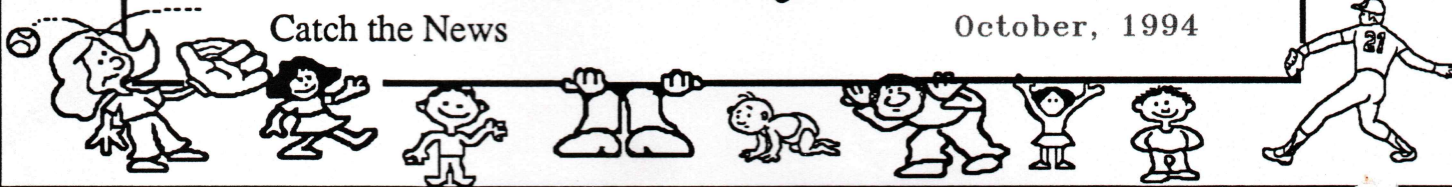

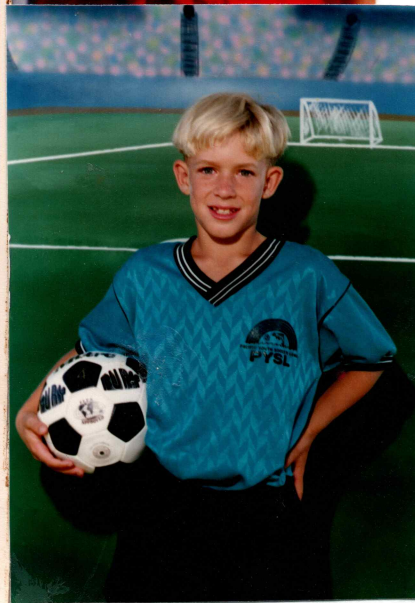

Another item in the sports area is that Francie and Jose have added to their back yard a basketball court area, and it is much enjoyed by the kids and their friends.

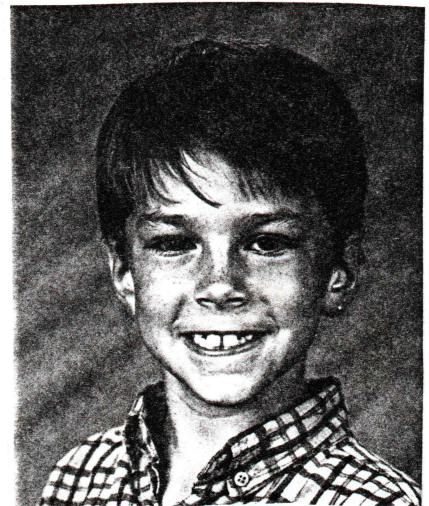

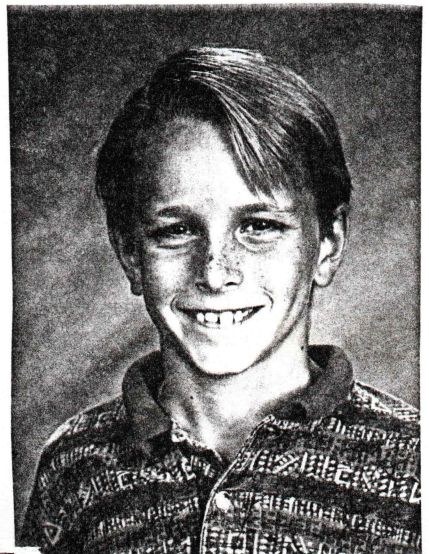

Dakota, to attend a trade show and represent her company, ISO, a manufacturer of chemicals used for permanents. The following write up appeared at a trade magazine supplement distributed at the meeting.

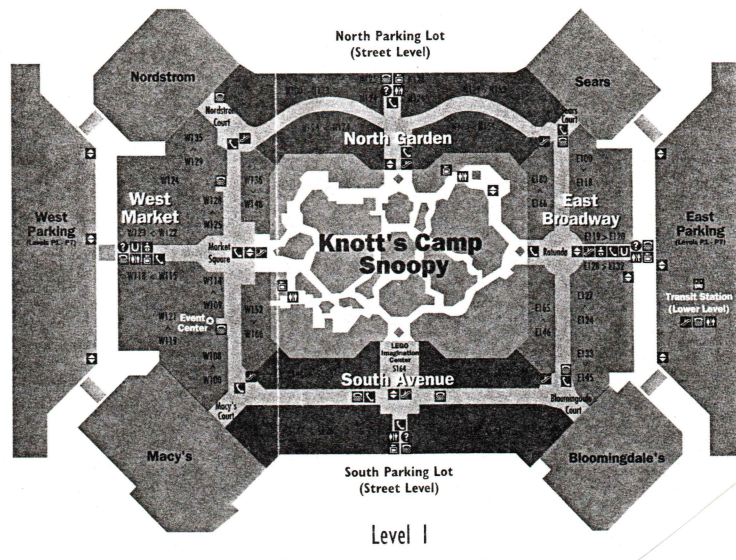

The Mall is indeed a shoppers paradise. As shown in the below plot plan, it consists of four major stores located at the four corners of the fully enclosed four story building. The spaces between the major stores are filled with about 400 small shops selling almost anything you can imagine. There are about 30 eating establishments, and in addition to the usual collection of specialty shops one can find 3 hologram stores, butterflies, Alamo flags, dogs and cats, indians and cowboys, Snoopy's Boutique, The Zoo Store, etc, etc. The feature attraction for kids, however, is located in the central section of the area. It is Knott's Camp Snoopy, and is filled with Knott's Berry Farm type rides.

Examples are Paul Bunyan's Log Chute, Pepsi Ripsaw Roller Coaster, Mystery Mine Ride, Kite Eating Tree, Snoopy Bounce, Balloon Race, Red Baron, etc. It seems like there is something for everyone at this place, and Francie reported that she carried out some power shopping in the few hours she had to spend. 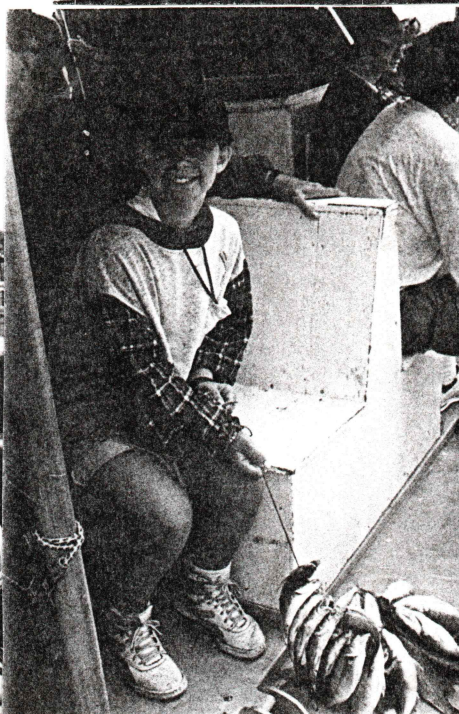
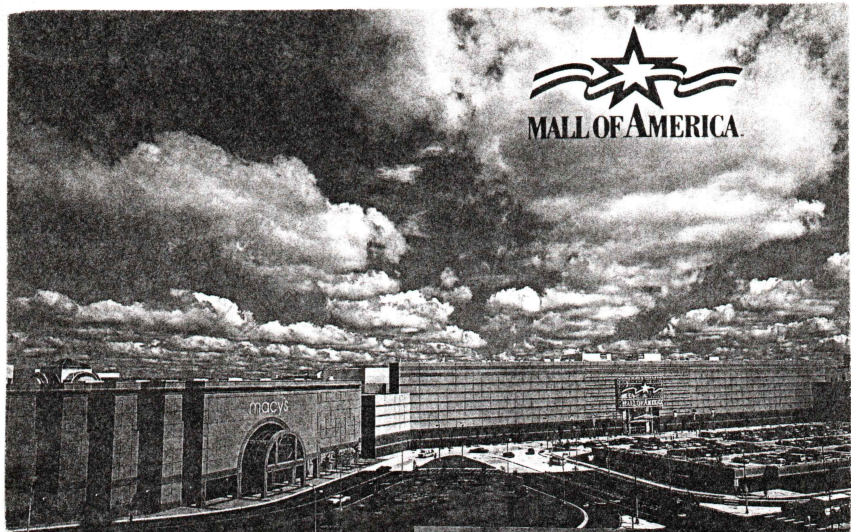
