BUD MEHAN WINS DISTINGUISHED TEACHER AWARD AT UCSD

On May 28, 1997 The San Diego Division of the Academic Senate of the University of California announced that Professor Hugh B. Mehan was this years winner of the Distinguished Teacher Award. The Award Certificate described the basis for the award as follows.

"Hugh Mehan has a major influence on primary and secondary education in the United States in his role as coordinator of UCSD's highly regarded Teacher Education Program and in recruiting students into teaching careers. His contributions to the sociology of education are recognized worldwide, especially his ability to bridge the gap between scholarly research and classroom practice. He has demonstrated to students how sociological concepts have immediate application and influence change in the educational system. He encourages students to handle social issues with rigor and apply what they learn to their lives outside the classroom. He is regarded as a teacher of virtuoso proportions, an inspirational mentor, generous in spirit and humor, and with the unique ability to make learning fun, and interesting, compromising the highest academic standards."

In addition to the UCSD certificate, shown in the next column, Bud also received three additional Certificates of Recognition, one signed by Teresa Hughes, Chairman of the State Assembly Education Committee, one by Howard Kaloogean, 74th District Assemblyman. and the third by Howard Layne, 78th District Assemblyman.

ROBERT RIEL PRESENTS PAPER AT ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR CONFERENCE

As we mentioned in the last issue of RFNL Robert returned recently from an Electrical Contractors Conference. The meeting was held at Santa Clara, California, and featured speakers and exhibits by suppliers. The title of Robert's paper was "Building Automation: Binding Logic to Reality" and the following abstract appeared in the program. "A presentation of issues dealing with the transition between network design and actual installation. It will highlight some of the real world challenges and solutions encountered during construction. The presentation will address code implications, component design, network configuration and other considerations, as seen from the installers point of view."

The information presented was sufficiently new and informative that a national trade magazine, Electrical Contractor, wrote up a very detailed account of the information presented. This article describes how the San Diego Electrical Training Center remodeling project was influenced by new technology to fully automate the facility, using state of the art automation concepts. When this decision was made the Director of the Training Center sent three volunteers, one of them Bob Riel, to a special training program put on at Knoxville, Tenn. Upon their return the final decision was made to introduce automation "the smart building" to the remodeling project. The result was a building

where the following functions controlled automatically by computer heating, ventilation and conditioning - lighting controls security - card access control landscape sprinklers sensors - closed circuit television power usage monitoring - fire alarm panel - and raising and lowering the flag each day. Robert and his two colleagues spent many week ends designing installing the automation facilities which represent the latest in building design. If any of you have not seen the facility it is well worth a visit, which can be arranged through Bob. We congratulate him on an important achievement in building design.



FAMILY CELEBRATES FATHER'S DAY WITH GOLF TOURNAMENT AND PICNIC AT PRESIDIO PARK






