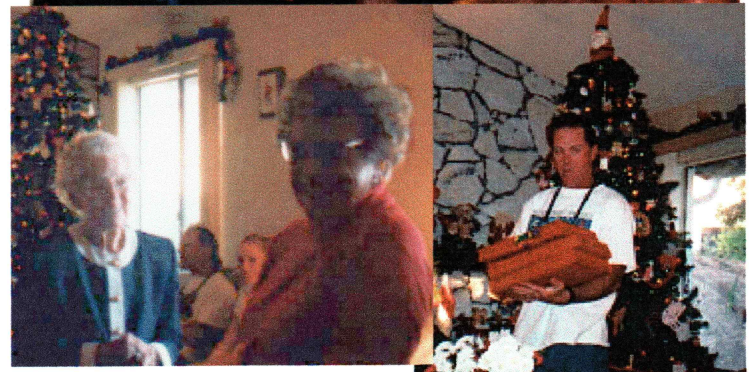
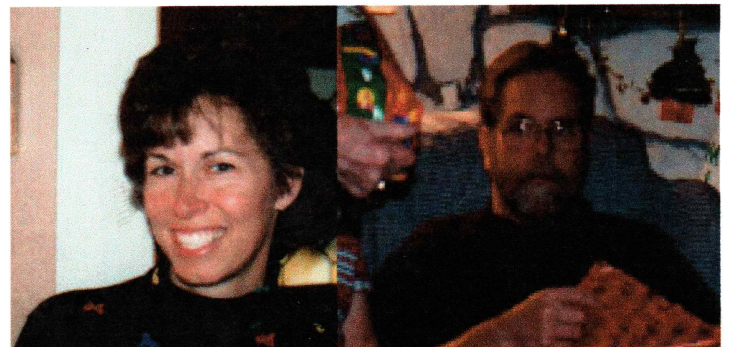
Some holiday celebrations

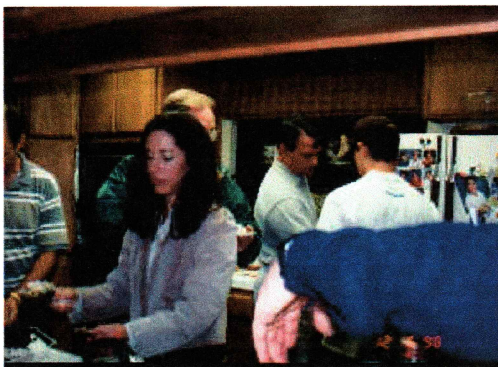

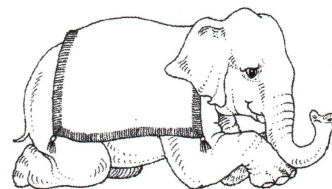
"Also, look at the Commissioner, he makes all the rules and no one can argue with him. He has a total monopoly over the games. For some reason I respect that"

It's time for the committee to set down the rules for this years exchange. They are as follows:

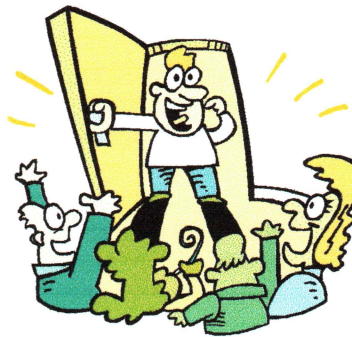
1. The winner of Riel Jeopardy has last pick and is not bound by any steal rules.

Object of the Game:

Place your family flag as close as possible to the correct location in the playing field. The winning family will be the one that is closest to the correct location as determined by the Commissioner (that's me).

1. Plastic Cup and Bowl (Commemorative – Yours to keep)
2. Safety Pin and Needle
3. Cork, Penny & Wire Clips
4. A Length of String

Additionally, Each team will need to take their team flag. Colors are as follows:

Green	Jeff & Carol Family Team
Blue	Bob & Listy Family Team
Yellow	Bruce & Birdy Family Team

The items in your bags can be altered, “put together”, modified or just plain messed with, by the following items on the work bench in the garage:

Black Marker, Side Cutters, Wire Cutters, Magnet, Water, Tape Measure and Square

All of these items are shared things and may not be taken from the garage (except the water). Be sure to read all of the rules so you'll know how to make changes to **your** stuff.

For those of you whom need technical help, Grandpa Riel will be standing by. However, you must tell him the “secret phrase” before he can help you. What is it you ask? Well simply look over the contents of your bag and then ask him a common question you would use to find out what he knows.

Once you have altered your “stuff” (yes you can go back and make further corrections later if you need to), proceed to the metal shed in the back yard. Find your flag color marked on the side of the shed with a piece of tape. You will notice a screw as been driven in it to mark the exact spot you will need to find.

After you have found your spot you must determine the difference in elevation from your spot to the spot marked with brown tape on the fence post across the yard (follow the hose to find this point). Use your imagination to find the best way to measure the change in elevation. Trust me when I tell you that everything has been provided so you can measure it to within $\frac{1}{2}$ a foot of accuracy.

For example let's say you calculated the difference in elevation to be 16". The nearest half-foot would be 18" or 1.5 feet. This 1.5 is now your multiplier and will be used to adjust your distances as called for below. For example, if you are told to go 15 times your multiplier, paces to the North. You would go 22.5 paces to the North ($15 \times 1.5 = 22.5$) assuming your multiplier was the 1.5 we calculated in the above example. Get it? I hope so.

Ok let's get started

1. From your starting point, (the screw on the side of the shed) go $20 \times$ your multiplier, paces (a pace is assumed to be exactly 2') to the North.
2. Then go your multiplier \times the number of family members born in November, paces to 33° West of South (this could be tricky but you math majors will get it right).
3. Add up the numbers in your "Current Address Location" (as in right this moment), divide it by 1 and multiply it by you multiplier and head West for that many paces.
4. Walk 2 paces East.
5. Go 2 paces North.
6. Now go 2 Paces West.
7. Hop 2 paces to the South and cluck like a chicken (my variation of an old joke).
8. Now look for the northern most, tall, white light and proceed directly to it, noting the direction.
9. If you get an "A" for your team color your next final direction is "W". If not go "E".
10. Calculate the square root of three to the 1000th place (Good now you know what it is. That may come in handy someday, but not today).
11. Take the number of family member girls that have a "E" in their first name (given or nickname i.e. Annie counts), times the number of family member boys that have a "S" in their first name and divide it by the number of family members that have a "Z" in their first name. Now factor in you multiplier and subtract 5. Step off that many paces.
12. If you are a Black or a Yellow add 15 feet more (only 15 feet, not paces)
13. Plant your flag and hope your right!

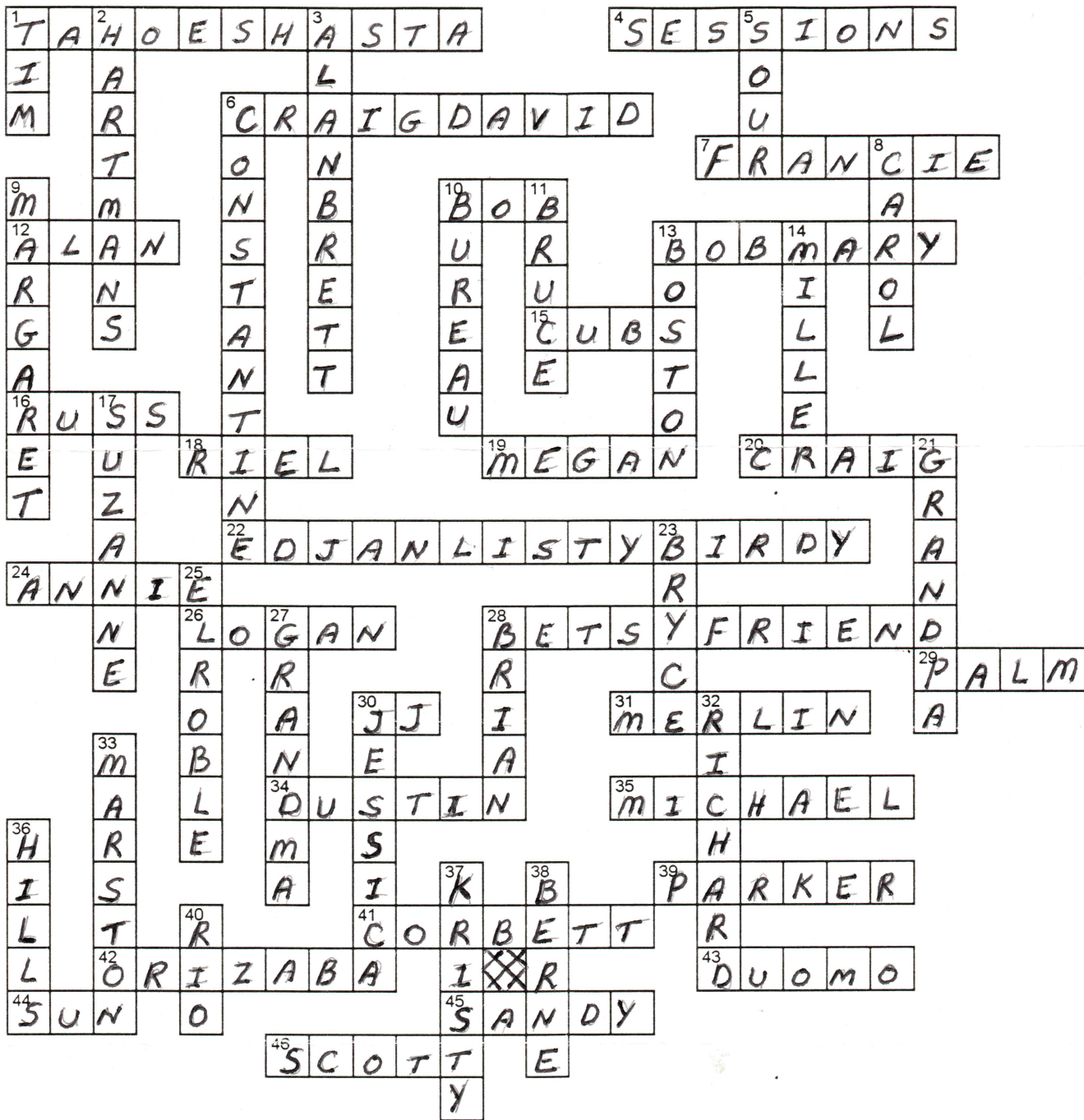
