Bud addresses faculty group at UCSD

On December 13, 2001 Professor Hugh Mehan addressed a select group of UCSD faculty members. His address was a part

of the Social Sciences Supper Club lecture series, and he was the third speaker in the series, which ran from October through December. The meeting was held at the UCSD Faculty Club, and



dinner was included prior to the talk. Since the 13th happened to be the evening when the presidential election finally was settled, the program included televised speeches by the two candidates. It was noted that most of the faculty applause was given at the conclusion of the Gore speech. The highlight of the evening, however, was Bud's presentation. First, he outlined some data he had collected on present and future population trends, by ethnic background, and how these trends will influence future enrollment at UCSD. He pointed out that in the past the



University has relied on brochures, prospective student campus tours and interviews to encourage future students. He pointed out that this passive approach has not helped

underprivileged youth gain access to the University system. In order to correct this

situation the CREATE Program was conceived, and Bud is the current director. The basic concept of the program is to interact with underprivileged children at the junior and senior high school levels, and help them acquire the skills needed to qualify them for the UC system. Activities include those shown in the above chart. The main objective is to help the underprivileged meet the academic standards established for admission to the UC system. Bud's presentation was outstanding, and inspired much discussion at the end of the formal presentation.

Margaret was present, and we enjoyed both the dinner and some lively discussion as was dined, and we thank her and Bud for treating us to this enjoyable evening.




Another wild story from Dubuque, Iowa


Dear Edith and Amb,
