News on Scott

While we were in Hawaii, Curtis woke up to the sound of Scott choking. He immediately rolled him on his side, and ran to get us. When we got into the room, Scott was on the floor, semi-conscious. There was blood on his pillow and on the floor. As Bruce tried to rouse Scott, he seemed very dazed and incoherent. Scott felt nauseous, so Bruce headed him towards the bathroom. About 10 minutes later Scott was clear headed and fine...minus a nasty bite he took out of his tongue! We realized that he must have had a seizure. We took him to a clinic on the island and had him checked out. They confirmed our suspicion, he indeed had a seizure. We were only one day away from returning home, so they suggested we start the testing as soon as we got home. Our doctor ran many test on Scott. The blood test showed that he had something viral going on, so we redid the lab work and discovered that he had Mononucleosis. Next, they scheduled an EEG, MRI, and a holter meter to test his irregular heart beat. The EEG came back normal. That was great news! He is currently wearing the holter monitor and is scheduled for the MRI in early October. The most likely cause of

the seizure, according to his neurologist, is the mono. However, we need to rule out brain tumors, or ? with the MRI first. So, We'll let you know if there is any new information to share. Otherwise, Hawaii was a blast!

We understand that Scott is feeling great now, and we hope that he will not have any future problems.

One of the other kids also experienced a health problem recently. Nathan was at the beach one day when another kid hit him and broke his jaw. The injury was so severe that a metal plate had to be inserted in his jaw, which now is wired shut. This means that he now is on a liquid diet for several weeks, until the injury heals. We will be celebrating Nathan's birthday soon, and we will get an update on his condition.
