Jeff celebrates 50th with surprise party


Yes, another family member celebrates a half-century of life! On March 22nd (one day

Craig had a not so good birthday this year. While at work, installing a large truck spring, Craig's middle finger on his left hand was smashed by the spring. The cut was so deep that it severed his tendon, which then proceeded to snap back into his wrist. OUCH!! He was taken to see a doctor who scheduled hand surgery right away to reconnect his tendons. The doctor doing the operation boasted to Craig, telling him how lucky he was to have the finest surgeon in California. Not only was he great at reconstruction surgery but he was one of the finest plastic surgeons. He promised Craig that he would barely notice the stitches. I decided that this was all good news. The surgery went well and Craig is back at work, on light duty. He goes to physical therapy three times a week. They glued this hook to his fingernail and they are planning on using a series of pulleys to work out his finger. This seems like a lot of trouble to make him bend his finger...but they are the experts! We are told that Craig will regain full use of his finger.


Love Birdy
