Old Town, where they took the trolley to the boarder. From there it was by taxi to the Tijuana airport. It turns out that it is less expensive to






fly from there rather than from San Diego. They spent some time enjoying the ocean as well as the local scene. As you can see from the pictures, it was a fun experience.
