As you can see in the above letter, Lyle has been promoted to Vice-President of the company he has been working at for many years. In addition, he




becomes a part owner, and we congratulate him and wish him much success in the future.

The magnitude of the problem is such that the company has set up a special operation to apply some patented technology to clean out corroded pipes and then apply a protective coating to prevent additional problems.
