Jessica and Miguel were blessed with a beautiful baby boy, Benicio Oliver Rios, on Saturday, July 9th at 3:57 pm. Sounds so simple... but the story starts in June when Jessica's doctor

said she needed to have a bump (a vascular growth) removed from her arm.

having this bump removed, the wound became infected and Jessica ended up in the hospital. She spent 4 long days battling a staph infection with antibiotics that gave her hives and a painkiller that caused her to faint. The stitches had to be removed and the infection drained but she won the battle. At 8 months pregnant, they monitored the baby throughout the entire ordeal and he seemed to do fine.

About a week after being home, she went for her 37 week check up and found out that her blood pressure was high. The doctor ordered a sonogram to see how the baby was doing. The test measured the baby at 4 lbs. which was smaller than normal for a 37 week baby. (Specifically, IUGR means the developing baby weighs less than 90% of other babies at the same gestational age.) Jessica's OB/GYN wanted her to get to 38 weeks because at that point the lungs and all other organs are fully developed. Jessica needed to

take her blood pressure throughout the day and as long as it was normal, she could stay

and kisses and of course don't forget the "Bless you Children" from Grandma Edith. We thank Birdy and Bruce for another wonderful 4th of July celebration.










Road Trip 2011

nce again it was time for our annual road trip vacation, so Karla and I (no Kids, Woo Hoo!) left on Friday the 10th of June for the great North West. After a quick hop through Las Vegas (no, we didn't even gamble) and a stopover in northern Utah we arrived at Yellowstone National Park.

Yellowstone can be deceiving; to the casual observer it has an almost zoo like atmosphere. Many of the animals are so used to seeing humans that they hardly blink as you pass by them. In fact, it's not uncommon for traffic to back up for miles just because the bison decid to walk down the middle of the road. However, once you start hiking into the back areas you understand that this is as real as it gets. The carcasses of bison remind you that every day is a life-or-death struggle for some of the park's inhabitants.

Yellowstone Park is bigger in area then the states Vermont and New Hampshire combined and over 90% of it is rugged backcoun-





try that few humans have ever seen. It is a beautiful park, one that has so many different areas and features. It can be warm and spring like on the West side while the East side still has over 10' (yes feet!) of snow and spring feels like it is still months away. This year they had twice the normal amount of snow which resulted in many of the animals (especially bears) still being in the lower areas. We saw many Grizzly bears, some as close as only 50 feet away (don't worry we were in the car with windows rolled up). All in all, Yellowstone has become our second favorite National Park and we encourage all you European travelers to think about seeing the good old USA for a change!

Next on the list was a return to our favorite Park, Glacier National Park located in Montana on the Canadian border. It is actually the first International Park with the Canadian side being called Watertown Lakes National Park. We like this park mostly for its rain forests, alpine meadows, beautiful lakes, and of course the glacier capped mountains. Sad to say, that they are predicting that all of the glaciers will be gone in the next 15 or so







years. However, this year they got record snowfalls and the "going to the sun road" was still closed with over 20' of snow still blocking it.

We spent about a week exploring this area, including the Canadian side. We went on several hikes but Karla's favorite thing to do was "Car hike". This is where we rented a 4X4 and explored old forest and primitive roads that lead to secluded prairies, lakes and rivers. We put over a 1,000 miles on that jeep in just under a week!

Next up, the Bad Lands of South Dakota. We visited both Wind and Jewel Caves National parks. Each Park has an extensive cave system that if set end to end would be hundreds of miles. Of course we took tours in each cave and it was very interesting. The one thing to note about these caves is that they do not have the formations like you would see in popular caverns like Carlsbad Caverns. But they are massive with branches going in



every direction including up and down. The entire cave systems are only 5-10% mapped out so there is still a lot to be found.

Also in the area is Custer State park and we again did some car hiking with another rented 4X4. It is a beautiful area with lots of wild bison roaming vast prairies, in some cases as far as the eye can see. We traveled back into areas where we were completely alone. I'd like to believe that we were able to experience a little of what the pioneers felt when they first entered the area.



All to soon it was time to move on so off to Colorado to visit Michael and Ashley. We found a campground that didn't look like it would be too far from their home but as it turned out was almost an hour away, not to mention up about 10,000 ft. in altitude. Michael was very gracious and came to pick us up so we could all have dinner together, including Ashley's mom Judy. We had a wonderful time and the long drive there and back gave us a chance to chance to talk with Michael about his life in Colorado.



With only four days left in our 3 ½ week vacation, on a whim, we decided to head back through Moab, Utah and visit Canyons and Arches National Parks. What

another beautiful place to visit! We again rented a 4X4 jeep (this car hiking thing is really catching on) but this time we went on jeep trails where you really needed all



4 wheel drive and in low, low gear. All I can say is two days is nowhere near enough time, and we both agreed that a return visit would be in order.

Heading home, we stopped by and visited Greg Guindon, my best friend now for almost 50 years. He and his wife, Ara live in Yucca, Arizona in the same house his parents used to live. Many family members may remember that back when I was about 18 Greg, and I would drive out and help his parents fix the place up. In fact their house was my first electrical wiring job learning from a book we got at Dixieline Lumber. Yes it's still there and hasn't burned down!

We got back home on July 3rd late in the evening and spent the next day cleaning out the RV and putting things away. We had a wonderful time and can hardly wait until next year's trip.
