



outside the operating room as the doctor administered the spinal anesthesia. Apparently too many fathers faint during the injection, so we are no longer allowed to watch, although I could have just as easily passed out sitting alone in the hallway for those 15 minutes (which felt like an eternity.)

Once inside, it was only another 10 minutes before we were both holding all 6 pounds, 15 ounces of the little guy. After a few hours, Lauren, Holden, and I were taken to our postpartum room where we were greeted by my Mom, Dad, Lauren's Mom, Jason, and Chavva. It was an amazing experience, and we are very thankful that we had everyone there to share it with.



We are extremely lucky to have a child with a very calm temperament and a strong urge to breast feed. We are



also equally (if not more) lucky to live with Lauren's mother who is a lactation consultant and pediatric nurse. We have had a few difficult nights, but we are managing just fine and have an amazing support system to help us out. Lauren is an amazing mother, and for me being a

Michelle reports that she survived the hurricane (even if they did lose power for 24 hours) finished her dissertation (to quote her "If I had known
















get my driver licenser and, now he is helping understand the bible.


Anything I can think of he will teach me, and thats why I love him.


Late News Flash:

Grandma treated for Hyponatremia at Sharp Memorial Emergency Facility

Since September the 5th was Labor Day we shifted our weekly golf game to Tuesday, the 6th. The morning was cool and overcast, but the forecast was for clearing afternoon skies. Grandma had dressed for the morning temperature, and we teed off at noon, Grandpa riding in a cart and Grandma walking and pulling her electric golf club cart. Soon the sky cleared and a hot sun shot the temperature up to a record humid 100 degrees. Everything was fine up to the eight hole, when Grandma was seen leaning against a tree. She complained of sudden severe neck and back pains and a bad feeling. She seemed somewhat disoriented. Grandpa took her in the electric cart and rushed her to the clubhouse. They called 911 and soon an emergency vehicle arrived. After a brief examination she was transferred to the ambulance and taken to the Sharp Memorial Hospital Emergency Facility. By the time Grandpa arrived she was feeling somewhat better, but the doctor ordered a blood chemistry test and an x-ray. The x ray showed nothing amiss, but the lab test revealed a lower than normal sodium ion level. It was concluded that the warm sleeve length blouse she was wearing caused excessive perspiration and salt loss. This condition, known as Hyponatremia, may cause severe weakness, anxiety, muscle spasms, confusion, and nausea. After an additional IV saline solution was administrated she felt ok, and the doctor released her to go home. The doctor pointed out that in addition to loss of salt by perspiration the ingestion of lots of water on a hot day also can lead to low sodium, by dilution. The lesson learned is that although too much salt in the diet is bad, too little also can be a problem. By Wednesday Grandma felt fine and resumed her normal activity.
