

So there you have it, we would like to thank everyone for entering and hope you all enjoyed Halloween as much as we did!





We have quite a few computer nerds in the family but did any of you know that Craig Hartman is probably one of the biggest nerds of all?

Although Craig got his start as a heavy truck mechanic he quickly rose through the ranks and moved to the commercial side of the Caterpillar business where we work on a multitude of applications including mega-yachts, US Navy ships, fishing boats, tug boats and generators of all sizes. It wasn't long before Craig became the go-to- guy on the power generation side of the business here at HawthorneCat. Craig has devoted tons of his personal

time into furthering his education and Hawthorne has also invested heavily in continued training opportunities for Craig. His idea of fun includes hacking smart phones, playing with computers, servers, alternate operating systems and Raspberry mini computers etc. (what a nerd!)

Today we send Craig all over the world to work through some of the more complex issues that others struggle with. His most recent project landed him back on the island of Kwajalein in the Marshall Islands. Kwajalein is a very small island measuring 2.5 miles in length and 800 yards wide at its widest point. It is a military base operated by the Army Corps of Engineers and its primary function is as the main radar array (of three arrays) making up the Ronald Regan Strategic Missile Defense Site, better known as "Star Wars." This site watches the skies over the Pacific and



keeps us safe from ICBM's while also filling the need as a strategic fuel reserve for the Pacific fleet...a big gas station in the middle of the Pacific Ocean!

Hawthorne was awarded a \$15M project to overhaul and convert three of their Caterpillar diesel generators to the latest-greatest electronic technology and also replace two of their diesel generators with the latest emission compliant electronic packages. Craig's role in this project has been the "startup and commissioning" of the completed generators. This is generally a two



to three week proposition per engine wherein all wiring, safeties, protective systems, SCADA Integration (supervisory control and data acquisition) and HMI (human machine interface) systems are tested and calibrated prior to starting a \$2M dollar overhaul or a \$4M new engine. Surprises are not something we like to see at startup!

The purpose of his latest trip in October was to gather data on the new six cylinder engine we sold and installed that doesn't want to play nicely (electrically) with the other six (Vee16) cylinder engines. Craig spent 10 days on island testing and collecting data to work with the generator manufac-

turer (Kato) engineers to correct an instability issue at a specific load point. His time on island proved that the issue is not originating from our supplied equipment, but rather, it is introduced by power plant influences and harmonics. This has been huge for Hawthorne due to the significant financial exposure that included the threat of replacing the \$4M dollar engine.

God bless the computer Nerds! Without guys like Craig that are truly engaged and love what they do, we would have to rethink taking on complex projects of this magnitude. Companies like Hawthorne and Robert's company, Dynalectric, are lucky to have one or two guys in their ranks that compete at this high level. ...And the best part is that Craig continues to be the humble Craig he has always been rather than the more typical Prima Donna, holier-than-thou, know-it-all technician that we have way too many of! Bet you didn't know this stuff about Craig, did ya?

## Hugh "Bud" Mehan, PhD



Hugh Mehan is Professor Emeritus of Sociology and Education at University of California, San Diego, an appointment that links his commitment to research and practice. He started the Teacher Education Program at UCSD and directed that Program from 1972 until 1998, when he became the founding director of The Center for Research on Educational Equity, Access, and Teaching Excellence (CREATE). CREATE coordinates efforts at UCSD to improve the academic preparation of under represented students through partnerships with K-12 schools and The Preuss School, UCSD's on-campus model charter school.

From the time he received his PhD in sociology from

University of California, Santa Barbara in 1971 until 1995, he studied challenges to educational equity manifested in classroom interaction, educational testing encounters, tracking practices, and the distribution of access to computers in schools. For the past 20 years, he has helped build equitable educational environments (The Preuss School, Gompers Preparatory Academy, and Groundwork San Diego in Southeastern San Diego) while documenting the processes of organizational change in those institutions.

He has authored seven books and edited an additional four. His most recent book, *In the Front Door* discusses his research on the political origins, culture, and organization of The Preuss School and Gompers Preparatory Academy. On Saturday November 8th, Bud Mehan was awarded the University of San Diego "Remarkable Leader Award" for 2014 for his career-long efforts to increase equity of access to college for students from underrepresented groups. He was instrumental in the design of two award winning schools, The Preuss School UCSD and Gompers Preparatory Academy. As the founding director of UCSD's Teaching Education Program (now Education Studies) and CREATE- Center Research Equity and Teaching Excellence on Bud's career has been dedicated to giving children a chance to overcome the inequities of birth through better education.

Family members attending the award ceremony included Edith, Margaret, Megan, Jeff & Carol. A number of good friends, Greg Cooper and Barbara Miller, and one of his first students, John Cotter, and many colleagues were also there to share in the celebration. Bud's picture and professional biography will be hung on the walls of Mother Rosalie Hall on the USD campus to inspire students who attend or visit USD.


