



The Benesch Owl Box

As many of you have already heard, we put up our first owl box! I have been wanting one after watching many through local cam sites. I asked some questions about purchasing one, when a neighbor on the Next Door app, offered me one he was taking down.

Jeff and I picked it up, cleaned and painted it, installed a nest cam, and with the help of our neighbors, erected it just off our patio in our backyard.

Within 3 days, we had a visiting owl. He would come and spend a few minutes looking around and then leave. Eventually he talked his mate into coming by and once she saw it, she seemed to give it the ok as they both moved in the Friday before Valentines' Day.

We have been told a number of times that it usually takes months and sometimes years for owls to move in, but once they do, you stand a very good chance of having a pair every year.













Barn Owls do not make their own nests, they use trees, barns, holes in cliffs, and boxes! We think that the lingering owl scent...a very strong scent, attracted the pair to our box. They moved in for good on February 10th and by Feb. 14th, we had our first egg!!

We named them Val 'n' Tino and have watched the mating rituals of the owl life cycle from the very beginning. I have since read a lot about owls, but watching it happen right outside our house is something we never expected!

Barn owls do not hoot, they screech. They call out a lot to each other and now while we are out in the evenings, we can hear them in the distance. We enjoy watching them fly in and out of the box. They are incredibly beautiful, and do not make a sound when they fly by. They don't seem to mind us staring and taking a few photos, which I'm enjoying immensely. We now have 4 eggs that we can see, but since Val has moved somewhat out of ideal cam view, there could be more. They lay between 4-10 with 6 being the average. Of those, usually only 2-4 owlets actually survive.

Our next adventure will be trying to get up to the 13' high box on a ladder while both of them are out of it hunting, so I can move the shifted camera back into place. Not an easy feat, so we are taking our time trying to figure out the best way. Stay tuned for pics of the new hatchlings in late March.
