



Happy Riel Thanksgiving





In and around food preparation was the first Turkey Athlete of the Year Competition. There were four events, 10 points each for a total of 40 possible points.


• Pickleball Serving – Can you serve the ball over the kitchen (a regular space on the pickleball court) and into the turkey cage (not a regular space)?

• Hula Hooping rounds - Now the hoop is on you, can you make it spin? This was the most fun event to watch!














We took a great train ride in Lihue to see farm animals! Aro loved using his throwing arm to feed tortillas to the pigs and alfalfa pellets to the horses.




