





Between all the activities, the TV was hosting various NCAA basketball games. No need to talk about UCLA unless it's the Women's team, he he. Maybe next year!




## **RFNL CONTEST**


### **UC** San Diego Sociology Colloquium Series Presents Hugh Mehan's Tribute to Aaron Cicourel

Aaron Cicourel's colleagues, students, family, and friends are joining us in celebrating his wisdom, warmth, humor, and unwavering support of all of us. Aaron brought to Sociology the principle that language plays an active role in creating and sustaining social structure and social reality. His work spans sociology, linguistics, anthropology, medicine, and cognitive science. In each, he battled mightily to convince his contemporaries such as Erving Goffman, Harold Garfinkel, and Noam Chomsky to recognize the wealth of empirical evidence for a reflexive relationship between social structure and social action—one that disrupted the stratifying machinery to construct more equitable social environments.
