We were driven to our Airbnb by the father of Julio Alonzo (organizer of the trip and USA rep for Wines of Chile). The Airbnb was absolutely beautiful and an excellent place to serve as HQ for Terroir.




However, before I could put all my stuff away, Paul and I were on our way to El Toro, the restaurant that would be the gracious host of Terroir during our stay. El Toro is a gorgeous spot in the bottom floor of a larger building and happened to be the epicenter of nightly drinking and revelry for what seemed every night of the week in Vintacura.

We quickly met with the owners and managers of El Toro and sat down for our first which conmeal. sisted of A LOT of wine (will become a theme) and some fantastic food. Seafood in Chile is absolutely delicious! My favorite was the Spanish Tortilla, which is potatoes sauteed and baked with whisked eggs and topped with some sea salt. The inside was soft and a little runny which was very nice.











We stayed at El Toro all night and you guessed it; we had wine and food for the entire time! Even got to see the owner's daughter and her crew perform Flamenco Dancing, which was cool. Day 2 saw us travel to the outskirts of Santiago to Santa Rita Winery. Santa Rita is the largest and most well-known winery in all of Chile. Paul and I got a nice tour of the estate, which dates back over 100 years!!! There is even a chapel built on the premises, which I know Ya Ya would have enjoyed. The whole property is gigantic and consisted of a nature preserve and a Roman Bath, which I was instructed not to jump into.

We joined the winemaker, Sebastian, for lunch and MORE WINE!!!! Not only was the scenery gorgeous and the food delicious, but it was quite an amazing experience eating dinner with a winemaker trying to impress Paul. Everything was brought out, and because Big Al and Francie raised me right, I made sure I was not rude and tasted and drank whatever was shoved my way. Don't worry Bridget!!!! I was on my best behavior and Sebastian, and I are best friends now.

After the lovely meal and world-class wines, we retreated to El Toro and proceeded to have a long night being introduced to the kitchen team and planning the menu for the following weeks.

The night was topped off with being introduced to Pisco Sours and my now favorite drink, The Piscola! Pisco and Cola served with a Lime in a Bordeaux glass. Heaven in a glass if you ask me, and I had several.

Day Three begins with me in the kitchen all day while Paul is swept away to a different winery to film his web series of Chilean wine. I got to meet my new best friend for the next week in Chef Camila and the team. We have been communicating for months now, but today was the day we finally got to show them my food and how I make it in person.

Being in South America everyone spoke Spanish, which if you know me I am super fluent...or not. Google Translate was used frequently, and with my broken Spanish and some timely sound effects, I was able to communicate enough. Here are some highlights of the first night:
















(57) ABSTRACT

Systems and methods are disclosed for a voice/chatbot building system. The voice/chatbot builder may involve receiving an identified intent, receiving a task related to the identified intent, and receiving a response related to both the identified intent and the task. The identified intent, task, and response may form a first conversation. The first conversation may be linked to other conversations to establish contextual relationships among conversations and determine conversation priority. 
